With support from all like-minded individuals and groups like you aiming for social transformation by helping Filipino children grow into balanced and mature individuals, The Kolisko School is now marching confidently to its second year with the intent of welcoming more students and adding a fifth grade. Our Hope

A Parent's Article

If you ask any Waldorf or Steiner parent how Waldorf inspired their children and influenced family life, you will likely hear more stories than you would care to listen to. Here is one of mine:

A few years ago, we attended a large family reunion highlighted by the usual overflowing food, laughter and children running about. After a while of mingling I went to look for my daughters, who were about 4 and 9 years old at the time. They had found their way to the room of the family's old matriarch, and there atop her sickbed, I saw them listening raptly to her retelling stories from her youth.

Everyone else at the party did not want to be around the idea of infirmity and sickness (and in truth, of the tired recounting of stories) so it was just the three of them there. But my daughters did not see the sickness so much as hear the stories. And they wanted nothing more at that time than to be with someone who could not enjoy the party like the others. To them, she was the most interesting person there.



I knew then that despite our many shortcomings as parents, we had done something right in sending them to a Steiner school, for it was clear that these two children had a capacity for human empathy that so many in our broken world have lost. Where did this capacity come from? We would like to think that it comes naturally in children, and encouraged from the example of the people they see everyday, in school and at home.

Nearly every parent who sends her children to a Steiner school will have such stories. **The Kolisko School** in New Manila, Quezon City is no different. It is in fact their collective experience of their children's unfolding that prompted twenty or so parents to found this particular non-profit Steiner school, so that other families will find access to it. In a very real way, the Kolisko School is a creative gift in idealism and hope.

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Acclaimed by UNESCO as the education for the new millennium, the non-sectarian Waldorf/Steiner Education used by the Kolisko School prepares young people to meet the world with inner confidence, to trust in the value of each human being, and to think and work with initiative in their lives. Within an age-specific stress-free environment, students are nurtured lovingly across the full range of human capacity physical, emotional, intellectual, artistic and spiritual - enabling children to develop a lifelong love of learning, acquire creative independence and balanced maturity in adulthood, and achieve an understanding of what is beautiful in the world in the broadest sense of the word.

Can we, then, take what is truly one of the best kept secrets in education and make it affordably accessible to the Filipino child?

That is our hope and we have worked hard over the last three years toward this goal. We are very thankful for all the benefactors whose faith and support have enabled The Kolisko School to open its doors in 2008.

As a recent addition to the thousands of independent Waldorf/Steiner schools worldwide that started from Germany in 1919, The Kolisko School is a true alternative to the kind of traditional schooling that is the norm today. Ask a Waldorf parent of an incident of child burnout and she will be hard put to think of one. Incredibly, Waldorf children will learn everything they are supposed to and will have honed capacities in the various aspects of human development. More than that, it is our ambition that these children in time become men of women of high purpose, who because of the way they grew up, will be in a position to make a meaningful contribution to the world. We have every reasonable hope that they will continue to be life-long learners in the spirit of the verse that Steiner children from the first to fourth grade recite every morning:

The sun with loving light
Makes bright for me each day.
The soul with spirit power
Gives strength into my limbs.
In sunlight shining clear
I reverence, O God,
The strength of humankind
Which thou, so graciously,
Hast planted in my soul
That I, with all my might,
May love to work and learn
From thee comes light and
strength

To thee rise love and thanks. ♥







Seasons & Rhythms:

Foundation of Education by Izza Pascual, Pre-School Teacher

One of the basic principles of early childhood in Steiner education/Waldorf Education is the recognition that young children readily learn about the world through their interaction with their environment. Thus, young children are guided in a playful activity both within the classroom and the outdoors.

An integral part of the Steiner preschool program is the outdoor playtime. Regardless of the season, children are encouraged to do meaningful tasks outdoors to develop appreciation for the natural world. When the children are out of their classroom, nature can provide the toys. The bark of the trees can be made into a boat that can float in a puddle; the leaves and twigs are used to make houses for the little ants to take shelter, the pebbles and rocks are built to make tiny bridges. All of these nature constructions help develop the young child's fine motor skills by practicing delicate finger movements.

Aside from playing, work also plays an important role in the child's development under the care of a Steiner preschool. With the teacher, the young children are engaged in meaningful work that is done as part



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of the rhythm for the week. There is a day for baking, for making soup, for doing crafts. There is also a day when the children would do some laundry washing, plant some seedlings, water the plants, weed some grass. The children's involvement in various activities exposes them to different dimensions and aspects of their lives important for their older years.

The children experience joy and enthusiasm as they take part in the rhythm of caring for their health (cooking, baking, preparing meals), their peers (working and helping each other, older kids guiding younger ones, sharing toys and eating together), taking care of the seedlings they planted (raking the soil, watering the plants) and taking part in nature's rhythm of growth and abundance (singing and storytelling about nature and seasons, playing under the sun or in light rain, nature walks).



The more they get exposed in these activities, the more the children develop a connection with the real world. The rhythm and activities also help them become more imaginative and inspired, kindling a love for learning and laying the foundation for creative thinking. These, more than memorization of facts and figures, are the true foundation for the kind of learning necessary to prepare them not only for later educational challenges but for life. ♥


